



OUR FEES

PRIVATE FEES

We appreciate the requirements of costs budgeting in the civil and family courts, and the need for individuals to budget their own expenditure. Whilst our barristers' fees are related to their differing hourly rates, fees for written and advisory work are agreed as fixed sums unless the solicitor or client prefers to be charged on a time-costed basis. We are happy to provide a quotation- without obligation- for advisory work, and stick to it. As far as possible we will give an indication, at the start of proceedings, of the fees which are likely to be incurred up to trial. If the nature of the work changes significantly during the course of the case we will alert you to any effect that may have on overall fees.

OTHER TYPES OF FUNDING

We carry out work under Conditional Fee Agreements in appropriate cases, and are happy to discuss risk sharing, delayed payment and other innovative ways of making the supply of legal services manageable for individuals.

PUBLICLY FUNDED WORK
